From the desk of the Executive Director

Join us for the Ninth Annual "Hands Around the Courthouse" to Recognize Child Abuse Prevention Month

Every child deserves to feel safe. Unfortunately many children in our great nation are not afforded this luxury. In fact, as of December 31, 2015 there were 872 cases of abuse and neglect on the Peoria County Juvenile Court docket. Sadly, Peoria ranks among the highest counties in Illinois in the *per capita* rate of abuse and neglect, and fourth statewide in raw numbers. In 2012-2014 the average rate of abuse and neglect was 18.4 per 1,000 children in Peoria County. These are staggering statistics.

Since 2008 the Youth Service Network Panel has been doing its part to raise awareness for Child Abuse Prevention Month here in Peoria by staging "Hands Around the Courthouse," which this year take place **Friday April 15, 2016 at noon at the Peoria County Courthouse Plaza**. We hope you can attend as we join hands in a moment of silence to recognize the challenges faced by Peoria County in protecting our children. We are overjoyed by the fact that this event has grown each year. This event includes speeches by local experts, musical performance by local children, and prayer.

Another great way to raise awareness is **Blue Sunday National Day of Prayer**. This event is held on **Sunday, April 24, 2016**. On this day, many churches will be requested to pray in their services for the victims of child abuse — and for those who rescue them. According to the Blue Sunday Child Abuse Prevention Initiative website, www.bluesunday.org, this day of prayer began in 1994 with twenty churches and has now grown to include over 70 million participants.

What can you do to help? Join us for Hands Around the Courthouse, **wear blue to show your commitment to preventing child abuse on Friday, April 8 for Wear Blue Day**, ask your church to participate in "Blue Sunday," become a CASA volunteer, or make a tax-deductible donation directly to CASA of Peoria County. You have the power to help break the cycle of abuse and neglect in our community!
